VOLUNTEER STAFF GUIDELINES

Throughout the years, our volunteer staff workers have been one of Monadnock Bible Conference's greatest assets. The voluntary help of youth and adults has helped make the Conference ministry what it is today. The program has also been especially helpful to the youth in their spiritual, physical, social, and mental growth. Volunteers must be at least 14 years old. Please read and have your parents read the following information to prepare for the ministry and working relationship. You must also have a medical form, signed by your parents, on file.

1. Please make arrangements through the Conference Secretary in advance of the weekend you wish to come. She knows the needs in each area, and the number of workers required.
2. On Sunday mornings, the staff must attend:
 - a) The program worship meeting or
 - b) A local Bible preaching church or
 - c) Special staff meeting
3. During Conference sponsored programs of a general nature (i.e. family weekend), staff are expected to attend all meetings unless assigned to a specific area such as nursery, children's meetings, or kitchen.
4. Bedtime is listed in the guest schedule. The person in charge of closing up at night will enforce this - please be a good example to our guests. Guys and girls rooms are off limits to the opposite sex. Do not take food to your rooms. Food other than designated leftovers are off limits. Keep your hands clean while working in the kitchen. Girls, keep your hair tied back from your face. Wear plastic gloves while working with food. Those under age 18 must get permission from the office to leave the grounds. **We also need parental approval on file.**
5. Youth 14 and 15 years of age cannot work more than 8 hours per day, or 40 hours per week. Youth under age 18 are not allowed to operate the frialators, meat slicer, bread slicer, large bakery mixers, chain saws, power driven motors, or cutters.
6. Please leave the grounds by 3:00 PM on the concluding day of the retreat unless special arrangements are made with a full-time staff member. This is for your safety as well as for our peace of mind.
7. Hot water from the stove in the kitchen will be handled and transported by John, the chef, his assistant, or an adult volunteer or staff person. In the event of a hot water spill, please be aware of the location of the burn kit in the kitchen. (The burn kit is located on the wall next to the staff table in the kitchen). Procedures for treating burns is located within the kit.
 1. 1st response to any hot water burn is to get cold water on burn immediately.
 2. Send a staff person for medical personal and burn kit.

KITCHEN - DINING ROOM RESPONSIBILITIES

Be in the kitchen 1 hour before meals - (earlier, if the Food Service Director requests it). Your responsibilities are to set, waitress, and wash tables; help with food preparation; vacuum dining rooms (under tables); keep sugar, salt, and pepper and napkin dispensers filled. Help with dishwashing, pots and silverware as needed.

Set up the pots and pans sink, dish sink, silverware buckets, sponge buckets, and the dishwasher; scrape, wash, and put away dishes, pots, and pans; sort and wash silverware; empty wastebaskets and replace liners; keep soda and juice machines stocked. Check with John or Jason before leaving the kitchen.

APPROPRIATE DRESS

It is Monadnock Bible Conference's goal and desire for staff, students, and volunteers to have an awesome time at Monadnock! We want nothing more than for you to have an experience of a lifetime. We want you to grow in your relationship with the Lord and each other. We also want you not to dress for the approval of others, but of God. We reserve the right to require staff, students and volunteers to alter or change their appearance as we deem necessary. Below is our dress code and policy.

❖ Pants, Shorts, & Skirts

- The length of shorts need to be half way between the hip and the knee or longer whether sitting or standing.
- Skirts should be no shorter than just above the knee.
- Attire should not be excessively torn, baggy, low cut, or skin tight.
- No tight fitting pants or shorts of any kind.
- No underwear/undergarments to be visible.

❖ T-Shirts, Tops, and Dresses

- Midriff or Halter tops are not allowed. If you cannot raise your arms above your head without exposing your stomach, your shirt is not appropriate.
- Girls must wear a bra.
- Straps on tank tops must cover girls bra straps. Spaghetti straps, halter tops and any low hanging neck lines or arm holes are not allowed.
- Spaghetti strap or backless dresses are not allowed.
- T-Shirts or other attire with offensive slogans or logos are prohibited.
- No tight fitting shirts of any kind.

❖ Swimwear

- Please bring a modest one-piece suit that is not high cut or wear a dark colored t-shirt over the swim suit you have.

Please bring appropriate footwear for kitchen work, as you will be on your feet for most of the day. Sneakers are fine, open toe footwear is not.
